WISE Canada Summit

The WISE Canada Summit 2025, held on Saturday, May 24 in Toronto, brought together educators, school leaders, and community advocates from across Canada for a landmark gathering dedicated to advancing Islamic education.

Organized by the WISE Foundation Canada, the summit provided a vibrant platform for dialogue, collaboration, and professional growth among Shia Islamic schools nationwide. WISE Canada Summit was the first time ever that all Shi'a Islamic schools in Canada gathered in one event. This beautiful event was hosted in As-Sadiq Islamic School. Founded in 1994 by the Islamic Shia Ithna Asheri Jamaat of Toronto, As-Sadiq Islamic School offers a continuous educational journey from preschool to high school.











The program featured keynote speaker Maulana Sayyid M. Rizvi, alongside presentations from leading educators and organizations. Sessions explored the formative history of Shi'a Islamic schooling in Canada, strategies for preserving Islamic identity in the diaspora, and innovative approaches to curriculum and pedagogy.

Workshops on staff well-being, school culture, and understanding tax structures for Islamic schools offered participants practical tools for strengthening their institutions.

A highlight of the summit was the collaborative session, The Way Forward, led by Sr. Sukaina Jaffer, which engaged participants in identifying common challenges and building actionable strategies for nationwide cooperation. School tours, exhibitions, and networking opportunities further enriched the experience, fostering meaningful connections and shared vision.

With its emphasis on innovation, collaboration, and faith-centered education, the WISE Canada Summit 2025 marked a significant step toward uniting Islamic schools in Canada and empowering the next generation of learners.

WISE Talks Canada regional competition also took place during this event and winners will compete in the final round in Najaf.







WISE Africa Summit

WISE Africa, in collaboration with Al Kisa Foundation, hosted a landmark summit in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, bringing together over 100 schools and institutions from Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, and South Africa. Held at WIPAHS School, the event fostered collaboration, innovation, and unity in Islamic education.

Dr. Kem Hussain, Senior Vice President of Global Strategy and Development at Cognia, delivered the keynote address, emphasizing global standards and educational excellence. Maulana Dr. Syed Nabi Raza Abidi inspired attendees with a powerful call for unity among schools, setting a strong foundation for future partnerships and shared growth.


